Biography:

- Born in Sonora Mexico
- Father was a <u>mariachi</u> musician
- Began composing at the age of 16
- His music incorporates forms and styles of his native Mexico
- Pieces have been conducted by Gustavo Dudadmel

Musical Details:

 Márquez is widely recognized as one of the most important Mexican composers of his generation

Activities:

- Read about, discuss, and listen to the piece "Alas" which is dedicated to Malala Yousafsai, a Pakistani activist who fought for education as a fundamental right of children and young people, which earned her the Nobel Price for Peace in 2014.
